Forgive & Forget: 1985
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No one can deny being affected by the events the nation went through during the state of emergencies of the 1980's, this Tuesday, Forgive & Forget closes in on a case that seeks to highlight the consequences of the past that many of us want to forget, with Arch Bishop Desmond Tutu and South African Human Rights Commissioner, Jody Kollapen lending their voices to the message of forgiveness.

At the height of school rioting and violence in the mid 80's, when communities were turning against one another and vandalism was the order of the day, a seemingly ordinary sport's event between two schools from the neighbouring communities of Bethlehem and Klerksdorp, became the opportunity to turn something peaceful into something rather sinister and disturbing.

1985 is a year that many people in Bohlokong township in Bethlehem will never forget. What started as a school sports event turned ugly, so ugly that it left two communities completely shattered. But now, 20 years later an ex-student from this community, Selby Mofokeng, seeks the help of Forgive & Forget to lead a reconciliation between the communities of Bethlehem and Klerksdorp.
