The duo chats about the play, what they enjoy about being actors and their passion for theatre. Relativity is a contemporary, epic tale exploring the underbelly of South African township life. At the centre of the drama is a serial killer, the "G-String Strangler", who is hunting down young women at night.

We chat to Sbu and TK, two dynamic 20something businessmen who own their own Record Label, TS Records. Since launching their label, they have grown tremendously producing big acts

like Brown Dash, Mzekezeke, and Ntando. They've also just recently launched TS Production, which will focus on TV productions.
