### **Judge for Yourself with Judge Dennis Davis Sunday 13 August at 6.30pm**

In this episode: Judge for Yourself debates artificial racial classifications creeping back into society and how these conflict with our non-racial constitution. Some critics argue that while the Population Registration Act was formally repealed in June 1991, the whole system has sneaked its way back.

In fact, they argue, it is impossible to do business and meet a host of regulatory requirements without knowing exactly what race your employees, employers and customers are.

Is government starting to discriminate between different levels of "the previously disadvantaged", namely that coloureds, too black under Apartheid, too white for the New South Africa, have been discriminated against from all directions.

Are black people being placed before coloureds in the equity queue?  
Is discrimination creeping back into our society?

Guests are Public Service Minister Geraldine Fraser-Moleketi, HSRC political analyst Dr Adam Habib, Karl Cloete of Cosatu (Regional Secretary of Numsa) and UCT political analyst Zwelethu Jalobe.

Apartheid laws governing race might have been scrapped. But has racial classification made a comeback thanks to BEE and

employment equity? And just how compatible is this with the principles of our non-racial constitution?
