Let's Fix It: Tuesday 19 July at 8.30pm

Let's Fix It is e.tv's half-hour, weekly reality series in which popular presenter Soli Philander is challenged to fix people's problems. Since its inception, the Let's Fix It team has assisted in helping many people alleviate the stress of poverty and hardship - with computers, wheelchairs, food, house-repairs, medical assistance and much more.

In this episode: Courtney Elson is a ten-year-old girl who was crowned Miss Petite Africa in 2004. During her reign she chose to help an organisation called Door of Hope, which operates from Hillbrow and Glenvista. She wrote a heart-wrenching letter to Let's Fix It. She says that since 2003 there has been an alarming increase in the number of abandoned babies and children. Door of Hope receives or collects abandoned babies and children from all over, and gives the children a loving home.

A hole in the wall at the church wall allows mothers to leave their babies at any time of the day or night. There is a sensor, which tells the people inside the house that there is a baby in the bin. The babies are fetched and taken to a safe baby house. Door of Hope helps little children to get a good start in life. Sadly, abandoned babies are left there at an alarming rate, beyond what Door of Hope often can cope with.
