This Week On 3rd Degree **Tuesday 20 September @ 8pm**

Why are there so many unsolved murders in South Africa each year? "My dad was killed in front of me when I was six-years-old and it makes me angry that justice hasn't been done." These are the heart-wrenching words of 16-year-old Laura Barford, whose father was gunned down 10 years ago as the family was returning from an evening out.

Sabine MacKinnon's musician husband was shot dead in cold blood in their home in Walkerville a year ago. And just three months ago 15-year-old Lindiwe and 12-year-old Nelisiwe Mbhele were raped and strangled on their way to a church meeting in Soweto.

These are just three of the thousands of murders that go unsolved each year in South Africa. Only 23% of the 20 000 murders committed during 2003/4 in our country were solved by the SAPS.
